All three of these children's books are exquisitely designed and produced—sure to attract and engage our young readers and their grown-ups.

By the time you are reading this letter, we will no doubt be in the trenches of production with our 2019 list and beyond, and we promise to do our best to continue publishing books that need to be books here at Cameron + Co!
